FSU-Teach Peer Mentor

A Peer Mentor is another student who can serve as a resource, a helping hand, a sounding board, and a referral service. The job of peer mentors is to provide support, encouragement, and information to students in their major (or anyone, really) who are just beginning the FSU-Teach program in Step 1 and Step 2. One of the great things about peer mentors is that they have had experience being in the program; they can give advice on coursework, lesson planning, FTCE, Research Methods, etc. They are also experts in the classroom field experiences they've had in FSU-Teach courses; ideally, they serve as both personal and professional support for the students they mentor.

Requirements

Peer Mentors must:

- 1. have a GPA of 2.5 or above.
- 2. have completed SMT 3100, Knowing & Learning.
- 3. turn in a plan of their FSU-Teach course of study (see #5 on back).
- 4. attend their FSU-Teach classes on any day they work. It is not acceptable to be too sick for class, but well enough to intern the same day.
- 5. be taking FSU-Teach courses during the semester.
- 6. attend WeTEACH meetings.

Duties

Peer Mentors must:

- 1. assist Step 1 Master Teachers by attending the class on scheduled exploration days to observe and provide feedback to Step 1 students on their exploration.
- 2. provide Step 1 students with feedback and other assistance (e.g., finding resources in 205 and 218) on their lesson plans during working hours.
- 3. provide tutoring to our students in introductory courses in math, chemistry, biology, etc. as requested during working hours.
- 4. research new strategies and technologies (e.g., 3-D printing, iPad apps, etc.) as requested by course instructors during working hours.

Responsibilities

Peer Mentors must:

- 1. never leave 218 unattended. Contact the main office (4-1935) if you need to leave for any reason.
- 2. make sure students sign in properly
- 3. keep all food and drinks (except water in a bottle) out of 218.
- 4. make sure the computers are turned off at the end of the day.
- 5. check resources in and out

These duties and responsibilities will be explained in more detail if you are selected to be a peer mentor.
