

Mathematics Education/FSU-Teach Clinical Faculty

Qualifications: A completed doctoral degree in Mathematics Education, teaching experience must include teaching mathematics in a public school at the middle or high school level, teaching mathematics at the post-secondary level, teaching mathematics education courses at the postsecondary level, and have evidence of meeting clinical educator requirements. The Clinical Faculty member in Mathematics Education/FSU-Teach should demonstrate a mastery of content and pedagogical content knowledge and the skills necessary to assist students in becoming knowledgeable about and capable of teaching using practices described the National Council of Teachers of Mathematics (NCTM), with a particular emphasis on inquiry-based mathematics teaching.

Responsibilities: Teach undergraduate and graduate level courses in mathematics education, advise and mentor undergraduate and graduate students; teach undergraduate courses in FSU-Teach, assist in developing courses for FSU-Teach, and participate in research and evaluation efforts within Mathematics Education and/or FSU-Teach.
